DESCRIPTION:

BLACK WIDOW is a proprietary blend of concentrated bacteria that us designed for use on turf areas affected by the accumulation of black algae. These select strains of bacteria colonize, rapidly reproduce and compete with the algae for food sources normally consumed by the algae, eventually depriving the algae of nutritional support.

TANK MIXING:

Do not mix with copper compounds or fungicides. Since the objective is to deprive algae of food, nitrogen and phosphate should not be added to spray mixture. Tank mixing with a superior soil penetrating surfactant is strongly recommended.

HOW TO APPLY:

Apply recommended rate to affected areas in sufficient water for coverage. **RECOMMENDED RATES:**

- Early Stages of Infestation: Apply 6-9 fl. oz. per 1000 f², and repeat at 4-6 fl. oz. in 10-14 days.
- Heavy Buildup: (Turf loss areas), Apply 9-12 fl. oz. per 1000 m², and repeat at 6.0 fl. oz. every 10-14 days until algae reaches manageable levels.
